## 2001-2010 Program Years Highlights

Key accomplishments under the current GWWN Executive Board leadership:

- Hosted high-quality monthly educational events/networking programs.
- Recruited professional prominent speakers and panel members, pro bono for the networking events.
- Raised funds to support the organization program initiatives.
- Identified and developed ways to resolve or address issues which directly affect the accomplishment of principal program goals and objectives. A major accomplishment in this area was an on-line payment process.
- Initiated, developed, and hosted Leadership and Award Program: Award recipients to date: 29 Women of Champion, 9 Booster Incentive, 22 Executive Board Leadership, 74 Special Recognition, and 10 Academic Scholarships Grants.
- Redesigned GWWN web site.
- Initiated and facilitated a volunteer program training seminar and broadened the volunteer recruitment campaign.
- Directed **77** volunteers
